

#### Pastor's Column

#### **Lumen Gentium IV**

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Note: This is not the homily. That can be

found on our website.

We return to our ongoing journey through the document *Lumen Gentium*. We last looked at the ways in which we have hope for the salvation of those who are not explicitly members of the Catholic Church. In short, anyone who sincerely seeks the truth and strives to live according to their conscience is therefore *connected* to the Catholic Church even if they don't realize it. At the final judgment, all people will see clearly how God entrusted the fullness of truth to the Catholic Church and established her as the Body of Christ. At that time, genuine seekers of truth and goodness will finally recognize in the Church everything they had sought in life. Thus, we say that all who go to heaven get there through the Catholic Church, even if they themselves don't see that until the end.

Of course, it bears repeating that sincerely seeking the truth and living according to our conscience is not easy. Without the guidance of the Gospel and the Church, without the assistance of grace given in the sacraments, the likelihood of someone living a just, honest, and good life is much lower. Some people think we might actually help people by not telling them about the gospel, as if giving them the gospel would somehow make it harder to know and love God. This document quotes St. Paul who says "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel!" It reminds us that the gifts of the Catholic faith are in fact gifts. By sharing the truth of the Catholic faith in a loving and convincing way, we increase the chances of someone getting to heaven. Also, becoming Catholic does not destroy the true, good, and beautiful things that a person knew and loved before. Lumen Gentium tells us that, "through her work, whatever good is in the minds and hearts of men, whatever good lies latent in the religious practices and cultures of diverse peoples, is not only saved from destruction but is also cleansed, raised up and perfected unto the glory of God, the confusion of the devil and the happiness of man." So yes, we have hope for people who die before coming Catholic, but that is absolutely not and excuse for never even trying to evangelize them.

Shifting gears, we next learn about the hierarchical structure of the Church. Jesus established the Catholic Church with a hierarchy on purpose - it wasn't added on later. He fully intended the Apostles to become the first Bishops with Peter as the first Pope and that each of them would in turn hand on that authority when the time came. This authority is real and comes from God himself, but it is of course not unlimited. They are entrusted with the Deposit of Faith in order to hand it on to future generations. As such, neither the Pope nor the Bishops can simply change the faith or add to it things that were not present in some form from the beginning. Bishops are also required to remain in union with one another and with the Pope in order to retain their special authority to interpret and hand on the truths of the faith. Based on Jesus own words to Peter - "I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it" (Matt 16:18) - the Pope is established by God as "the perpetual and visible principle and foundation of unity of both the bishops and of the faithful." Bishops, in turn, are "visible principle and foundation of unity in their particular churches" (i.e. dioceses). So, we're taught that "the individual bishops represent each his own church, but all of them together and with the Pope represent the entire Church in the bond of peace, love and unity." As St. Irenaeus put it "Wherever the bishop appears, there let the people be; as wherever Jesus Christ is, there is the Catholic Church."

Of course, all this authority is rooted in their call to serve. To teach, lead, and even correct someone can be and ought to be an act of service. As such, the Bishops' foremost responsibility is to proclaim the Gospel and to "bring forth from the treasury of Revelation new things and old, making it bear fruit and vigilantly warding off any errors that threaten their flock." This, in turn, means that we have a responsibility to accept and follow their legitimate teaching. The document explains that "Bishops, teaching in communion with the Roman Pontiff, are to be respected by all as witnesses to divine and Catholic truth. In matters of faith and morals, the bishops speak in the name of Christ." Because of this "the faithful are to accept their teaching and adhere to it with a religious assent."

Now, the idea of "religious submission of mind and will" mentioned here is something easily misunderstood. So, we'll spend a fair amount of time unpacking it as we continue our journey through this Dogmatic Constitution on the Church.
