

Pastoral Council Nominations

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Note: This is not the homily. That can be found on our website.



It's once again time to nominate new members of the Pastoral Council. This council is a primarily elected group of parishioners who, well, counsel the priest in his pastoral ministry to the parish. They also serve as a channel of communication between priest and parishioners and vice versa. Normally, the members are nominated by parishioners and then elected, with some provisions to make sure they are faithfully practicing Catholics. The Trustees of the parish serve on the council as well and then the pastor also gets to appoint a few members whom he thinks will help to represent parts of the parish not always visible to the general public.

The council meets roughly 4 times a year, though additional meetings can be called when necessary. These meetings consist of updates about the life of the parish, discussions regarding future pastoral efforts, and consultation regarding major projects.

Our Pastoral Council is made up of 11 members: 2 Trustees, 3 appointed, 6 elected. Members serve a 3 year term and each year in January, 2 elected seats and 1 appointed seat is opened up. We are grateful to John Bourgeois, Ellen Switzer, and Kim Hebert for their service on the council. With those seats open, I'm asking for nominations to fill 2 of them. The 3rd seat will be filled by appointment. Within the next two weeks, please submit names to the office using the nomination form you can find by the doors or in the office. Once nominations have been received, we will provide a list of names in the bulletin and then host elections at the end of February.

To qualify for the council, the person must be:

- * An active, registered, and contributing member of St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church
- * Faithful to Catholic teaching in word and action (this doesn't mean they're perfect, but that they try)
- * Interested in the future of the parish
- * Able to respectfully and thoughtfully articulate their position, even when it is not the same as the Pastor's
- *Willing to spend time and effort completing tasks in service to the mission of the parish (not just talk, but do)
- * Previous members of the council are eligible for re-election/re-appointment

Thank you for your prayerful consideration and I look forward to working with you all for our future.
