Pastor's Column

The Mother of God & **New Year's Resolutions** Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

A blessed Feast of Mary, Mother of God to everyone! In most western cultures, people are celebrating the New Year today. Of course, we are members of that western culture, so a Happy New Year to you as well. We began our Liturgical New Year on the First Sunday of Advent, but there's nothing wrong with embracing cultural traditions as long as they aren't contrary to our faith - and this one isn't. There are lots of wonderful customs attached to this day: fireworks, counting down to midnight, parties, and even the kiss at midnight (done chastely and/or with the appropriate partner) are all things we can enjoy. Now, our way of celebrating those things should look at least a little different from the world's - we should avoid drunkenness, for example - but there's much good there.

One New Year's tradition we can definitely make great use of is the New Year's resolution. Taking advantage of the spirit of new beginnings and the general sense of hope that's usually part of this season, this desire to be and do better is deeply compatible with our Christian call to ongoing conversion. Anyone who thinks they have "arrived" - that they no longer need to grow, learn, and be converted - they are in a dangerous place. So, yes, let us make good resolutions and strive to improve. As I've written in this column in the past, this is a practice we should bring to the Lord in order to be guided to improve not just what we want for ourselves, but what He wants for us. And our faith tells us that what He desires for us is always greater than what we desire for ourselves: "What eye has not seen, and ear has not heard, and what has not entered the human heart, what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Cor 2:9).

So, that's the first piece of advice: pray and ask God to guide your resolution. Left to ourselves, we all too often focus on the wrong things. Or we fall short and into despair. Or we succeed and give ourselves too much credit, falling into the most dangerous sin of pride and self-sufficiency. As many a theologian and saint has pointed out: Satan will gladly let us grow in almost any virtue, so long as we also grow in pride.

The second piece of advice for your New Year's resolution is related to the first: humility and patience. The route to greatness in anything is not sudden an dramatic success. It is the accumulation of a thousand little steps, an often imperceptible growth over time. God can and sometimes does grant sudden, radical conversions or stunning new virtues, but that doesn't mean we can resolve ourselves into that kind of success. So, set realistic goals. It should be a genuine challenge, a genuine improvement over what was, but try not to look too far ahead. Focus on virtues instead of accomplishments, habits instead of glory. If wanting to learn an instrument, for instance, don't resolve to "be great at this instrument next year." Instead, resolve to practice 15 minutes a day. We see in this that goals should also be something concrete and measurable. Vague self-assurance that "I will be better" doesn't provide motivation, but a specific standard does. If, for instance, you want to resolve to not wait to the last minute for Christmas gifts next year, don't just leave that vague intention. Instead, go ahead in your calendar and add in specific days that you'll spend a hour or two on that goal.

Lastly, I want to offer two suggestions of resolutions you should consider. If you don't pray every day, start doing that! I cannot stress how important this is. You might think there's not much difference between 0 minutes of prayer and 10 minutes of prayer, but there is! Praying even just a little while every day can dramatically improve your relationship with God and, through that, just about everything else. Even just the tiniest step, the easiest resolution of 10-15 minutes a day is a huge leap forward. And if you already pray every day, reflect on how to improve, deepen, or lengthen that prayer in a concrete way. I often recommend Lectio Divina. Look into and try it.

If you don't know your faith well, consider making that a resolution. You can start attending our Whole Family Catechism classes once a month. Adults are welcome to come even if they don't have children in the program. There are also thousands of apps designed to help. I recommend you check out the Catechism in a Year podcast starting this year. Fr. Mike Schmitz did the Bible in a Year Podcast, which was the no. 1 podcast in the country two years in a row. If you haven't finished that one, try picking up where you left off. If you have, try this new one, which you can find at <u>ascensionpress.com /pages/catechisminayear</u>. I think you'll find out all kinds of things you didn't know about your faith, you'll get answers to questions you didn't know you had, and you'll find your relationship with God improving all along the way. If you think listening to a whole podcast each day is too much, then make the resolution to listen 3x a week, or 15 minutes a day. It's titled "in a Year," but there's really nothing wrong with taking a year and a half or two years or more to get through it, so long as you are chipping away at it.

Finally, don't forget whose feast is today. Invite Mary to help you and guide in these resolutions. By the grace of God and through Mary's intercession, may the year 2023 be full of love and grace, no matter what else it may bring.
