

Pope St. Paul VI

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Not long after completing his Encyclical Pacem in Terris, Pope St. John XXIII died June 3, 1963. He was beatified in the year 2000 by Pope St. John Paul II and Canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014. What made his death rather inconvenient was the fact that he has called for an Ecumenical Council in the year 1959. It took a few years to organize and officially began on October 11, 1962. Having the pope die just a few months into the council shook up everyone's expectations and caused everyone to wonder what they would get with the next pope.

That man turned out to be Giovanni Battista Enrico Antonio Maria Montini, born September 26, 1897 in the village of Concesio in Lombardy, Italy. His father was a member of the Italian Parliament and his mother had come from rural nobility. He attended seminary and was **ordained a priest in 1920**. He also received a doctorate in canon law (Church law). Because of his organizational skills, he served in the Secretariat of State starting in the year 1922, working under a variety of bishops and cardinals who led it. One of his assignments was as the secretary to the Papal Nuncio in Poland, where he saw first hand some of the challenges faced by the Polish people. Because he began his priesthood in service to the organizational and diplomatic aspects of the Church, he never served as a parish priest.

From there, he served in a variety of posts within the Roman Curia (the central organizational structure of the Church) as secretary, teacher, and canon lawyer. He eventually served as a kind of "chief of staff" for the Secretary of State, which put him into daily contact with Pope Pius XII and they developed a good friendship. One of his responsibilities in this role was to answer letters sent to the pope from al over the world. He also helped Pope Pius XII to help people find information about prisoners of war and refugees displaced by World War II. Eventually, Montini (future Paul VI) was appointed to share the role of Secretary of State, where he continued to organize charity efforts for those affected by the war.

Montini was appointed the Archbishop of Milan in 1954, a role he officially began in January of 1955. He immediately dove into meeting with a variety of different groups within his diocese, overseeing the building of new churches, and addressing the social issues of the day. Pope Pius XII died in 1958 and Pope John XXIII replaced him. Not long after that, Pope John made Archbishop Montini into **a Cardinal in December 1958**. Rather famously, when Pope John XXIII called for the Second Vatican Council, Montini remarked to a friend that "this holy old boy doesn't realize what a hornet's nest he's stirring up." Nonetheless, the council was called for and Montini was made part of the Commission planning the event. John XXIII wanted the entire council to take place in a single session in 1962, which we know did not work out as he intended.

In the Papal Conclave of June, 1963, Montini was elected pope after 6 ballots. He was elected in part because of his familiarity with the inner workings of the Vatican and because he was seen as a person likely to continue the Second Vatican Council. He took the name Pope Paul VI. As pope during the most recent ecumenical council, Paul VI's legacy is hotly contested and debated. He reigned during a time of great social chance and great confusion in and outside the Church. Some decry him as the one who wrecked the Church, others credit him with great wisdom and insight.

The two most significant things of his papacy were the council itself and his encyclical **Humanae Vitae**, which dealt with the question of birth control and was very much hated by many people when it was released. Many of the same people who applauded his handling of the council decried this encyclical. As is often the case for leaders, doing your job well can mean discovering that few people are truly your allies in everything.

There is still a lot of controversy around Pope St. Paul VI's leadership and legacy as well as quite a few nasty rumors. His efforts regarding ecumenism, liturgical reform, and social teaching all provoked a variety of enemies. Nonetheless, Pope Paul VI was declared a saint in 2014. This does not mean everything he did as pope was perfect or beyond question, but it does mean that by the end of his life, he lived a life of holiness and heroic virtue. We will take a look at some of his encyclicals and then spend quite a long time on the Second Vatican Council itself.


