

Pastor's Column

Christ is King!

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Two weeks from now, we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King. This major feast of the Church always falls on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time and was instated to remind us and the world that Jesus is king over all time and space. For this reason, it is meant to be a big celebration.

Every year, we honor this feast with a Eucharistic Procession. Think of it like a parade that celebrates our king in a very public and visible way. Bring Christ with us into the streets of our community is an act of devotion and of evangelization. Just recently, Catholics in New York City made headlines with their Eucharistic Procession. People, even non-Catholics, were moved by the piety and beauty of the event. A procession is also a great way of blessing our community, asking for the Kingship of Jesus Christ to be more firmly established around us. It is a prayer for peace and renewal and conversion in our community. In years past, our procession went through the cemetery so that we could also pray for our deceased loved ones.



This year, we are going to go through the city and across the bayou to conclude at Our Lady of the Rosary Catholic Church. Part of the reason for this is the ongoing National Eucharistic Revival. We want to elevate our usual celebration a bit by making it longer and bringing it through the city. Even more importantly, this is an important expression of the unity and cooperation between the two Catholic churches in Jeanerette. We are united in faith and this is a chance for us to be united in prayer and presence as we honor Jesus who is king of us all.

In order to do this, we're going to change the timing a little so that our arrival at Our Lady of the Rosary coincides with the conclusion of their 10am Mass. What we'll do is aim to start the procession from here around 10:30am, so that we arrive just after 11 when their Mass is usually wrapping up. As you know, our 9am Mass is usually finished before 10. So, between 10 and 10:30, we'll have a light reception in front of

the Church to celebrate Christ the King. This will give us a chance to stretch our legs, use the bathroom, eat a little something to tide us over, and generally just celebrate Jesus' Kingship. Then we'll go back into the Church at 10:30(ish) to start the procession over towards Our Lady of the Rosary Church. We'll arrive just as their Mass ends and go into the Church. We'll all pray together briefly before concluding with Benediction. I encourage people to stay and visit with people there after. I suspect everything will wrap up around 11:30am.

The procession will 1 mile long. We will have a police escort to help us make that trek. If you aren't able to walk that far, please don't think you can't join us! I'm planning to have some people bring golf carts so you can join in! If we don't have enough of those, please follow in your car. I've also asked a few people to be on hand to shuttle people back from Rosary to St. John's once everything is over so you don't have to walk another mile if you don't want to.

If you're in town, I fervently encourage you plan to participate in this historic event. It is a great way to honor Christ the king, to pray for blessings upon our community, to express our unity, and perhaps help to heal any old wounds or divisions that may be lingering. I don't know the last time such a procession was done involving both Churches, if ever. God cannot be outdone in generosity, so if you're willing to give him this extra time and effort to honor the kingship of his Son, it will be most beneficial for you and for us all. I have personally been enormously blessed, strengthened, and healed by such processions in the past and cannot recommend them enough.

Finally, even if you can't participate, please pray for good weather, smooth planning, and for the safety and holiness of all involved. May God bless our efforts and Long Live Christ the King!
