

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Restoring our Church: iGiveCatholic 2023

Every year we participate in the nationwide #iGiveCatholic campaign that takes place on Giving Tuesday. Giving Tuesday - the Tuesday after Thanksgiving - is like Black Friday and Cyber Monday except that instead of focusing on shopping for Christmas presents, it has become a traditional day to make donations to a wide variety of causes. The Diocese of Lafayette has enabled parishes to take advantage of this custom to raise funds for their projects. In the past, we've used this campaign to raise money for our sound system, the windows, and updating the lighting and electrical in the Church. I'm deeply grateful for the generosity of this community for those past projects and for what it has enabled us to accomplish. The lighting and electrical work is ongoing (you can see the temporary lights) and I'm told that the parts will be

arriving in the next month or two. Again, thank you for helping to make that necessary update possible.

This year, **our project is the exterior walls of the Church**. We did some touch up work to the missing bricks a few years ago, but now it is time to go over the whole building to do some tuck-pointing, sealing, and brick replacements.

The last time a large-scale touch up like that was done was in the 1950s, so it's overdue. We also intend to use a soft wash to get rid of the lichen, algae, and dirt buildup so as to restore the red color of the building. As you may have noticed, the bricks that fall off of the building are always the ones on the sloped part of the external columns (buttresses). The reason for this is that that slope design allows water to flow over and into the mortar, eventually washing it away and dislodging the bricks. So, as part of the project, we are to remove all the bricks on the sloped portions and replace them with a single, solid piece of stone that will be much more resistant to wear and less likely to allow water to get behind the bricks. Once done, this will help to keep the building in good shape for decades to come.

The **estimated cost for all of this is \$80,000**. A generous donor has already put \$35,000 towards that goal. So, I'm asking that all parishioners prayerfully consider making a sacrificial gift to help us make it the rest of the way. Please spread the word to other people who would be interested in seeing the exterior of the Church restored and preserved. Share posts on social media, tell friends and family who moved away, and generally make it known that this a great opportunity to help

You can go to Lafayette.iGiveCatholic.org and search for "St. John the Evangelist" to find our giving page. The actual **giving day is**November 28th, but early giving has already begun and so we can accept donations right now. You can also give in person at the office or via the #iGiveCatholic envelopes located in the Church. We will continue to accept donations to the cause through January via in-person or envelope giving.

Thank you again for your continued generosity and support of the Church and our parish. With God's help, our church will continue to bear witness to his glory and beauty for generations to come!
