

Pastor's Column

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Lumen Gentium II: The People of God

Before the financial report, we had begun to look at the Second Vatican Council's document on the Constitution of the Church, **Lumen Gentium**. We saw the many different metaphors used to describe the Church in Scripture and throughout history. Today, we resume our study of this document with a look at how the council describes the "People of God." This section begins with an emphatic declaration that God has "given welcome" to whoever seeks him "at all times and in every race." In a few other places as well, this document makes it clear that racial and cultural differences are secondary to the fundamental unity of humanity and the universal call to holiness and salvation. Individuals of every race are called to salvation. At the same time, however, God "does not make men holy and save them merely as individuals, without bond or link between one another." God's plan from the beginning was to form a "people," a "holy nation." Even though this "messianic people" does not include all individuals at this time, it is still a sign and "seed" of the "unity, hope and salvation for the whole human race." Rather than being built on the idea of excluding certain people, the Church and the people of God is the visible sign of God's desire to bring all people into union with Himself and with each other. The Church and the people of God face many trials in the "desert" of this life and they must go through the Cross of Jesus Christ in order to complete their mission.

By being baptized into Jesus Christ, every member of the Church shares in the call to be "a kingdom and priests to God the Father." This "common priesthood of the faithful" (also called "Baptismal priesthood") means that every Christian is called to offer "spiritual sacrifices" as part of their mission to bring salvation to the whole world. Although ministerial priests (ordained men) have a different role, it is still true that the laity do really "join in the offering of the Eucharist." It's part of why the Church requires us to go to Mass every Sunday. You aren't just there to receive communion, you are there to join in the offering, the sacrifice to God as part of your Baptismal priesthood.

This "spiritual sacrifice" also extends to your whole life: the basic effort to avoid sin, grow in holiness, and love your neighbor. Each of the sacraments expresses some aspect of this. Confirmation fills the Baptized with the grace to not only receive salvation, but to proclaim it to others. The Sacrament of Confession not only reunites a person to God, but also the whole Church. It also strengthens them to forgive others and life in peace with God and His Church. Anointing of the Sick strengthens a person with the prayers of the whole Church and then takes that person's private suffering, unites it to the Cross of Christ, and so makes it a channel of grace for the whole world. Holy Orders ordains certain men into positions of service, providing leadership, sacraments, and teaching for the good of all. Matrimony allows two Christians to not only love and serve each other, but also helps them to become living signs to the whole world of the kind of faithful, spousal love that God has for humanity. That, and it provides new children which, by being Baptized, increases the number of the people of God in the world. Over and above the Sacraments and the moral teachings, God also gives his people other gifts. Called "Charisms," these gifts enable each of the Baptized to serve the Church and the world with a special help from God.

Being part of the "People of God" means having a loyalty that transcends individual cultures and races. The Kingdom of Heaven is not of this world. This does not negate the diversity of peoples throughout the world. In fact, it enriches them by purifying and strengthening the unique good of diverse cultures with the wisdom and power of the God who transcends them all. The Council also reiterates that ancient teaching that salvation comes through the Church. Anyone who is saved is saved by God's grace through the Church. Of course, in this broken world, membership in the Church and People of God is not always clearly manifest in the same way for every person. So, the document then goes step by step through the degrees, so to speak, of incorporation into the Church and how that can contribute to their salvation.

The first "degree" is those who are Baptized Catholic and who participate directly in the sacramental life of the Church. They are fully incorporated into the Church and share its gifts. This does, however, require them to sincerely make use of those gifts - mere membership as a Catholic does no good if a person does not maintain a living faith. Next week, we'll pick up on what salvation might look like for those who's connection to the One, True Church is not obvious.
