

Pastor's Column

Sacrosanctum Concilium V

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Note: This is not the homily. That can be found on our website.

Next in our ongoing journey through the document *Sacrosanctum Concilium* (1963), we see that the Second Vatican Council wanted to remind Catholics of their connection to their local bishop. It notes that the "pre-eminent manifestation of the Church consists in... the participation of all God's holy people... in the same Eucharist, in a single prayer, at one altar, at which presides the bishop surrounded by his college of priests and by his ministers." This is the reason I often tell people to try to attend at least one Priestly or Diaconal Ordination in their lifetime. It is the Church ar her best and a powerful image of what it means to belong to the Catholic Church - unity with the bishop, his priests and deacons, and all the people of God in a single act of profound and beautiful worship.

Obviously, it is not possible for everyone in the diocese to always be at every Mass celebrated by the Bishop. So, the bishops establishes parishes with pastors to carry out ministry in his name. Remembering the ideal and the connection is important, however, and so liturgy at every parish in the diocese should try to manifest that unity in some way. It's part of the reason we mention the local bishop's name in every Mass. It is also why the Bishop strives to visit every parish at least periodically for Confirmations and other major events. The document also calls for the establishment of "commissions" or committees to study and promote the liturgy at the global and local levels. My role as the Director of the Office of Worship for the Diocese of Lafayette is to do just that.

The document then goes on to repeat the call for greater engagement of the laity in the celebration of the Mass. As we mentioned in a previous article, this includes simplifying the rituals somewhat as well as the use of the "mother tongue" (vernacular, English for us). The Church does ask that some Latin be preserved and that "steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them." It also asks for more scripture readings over the course of the year. That was done - we do hear more scripture than in the older form of the Mass. The Council also restored the "prayer of the faithful," (intercessions after the creed) which you'll notice has become a regular part of every Sunday Mass. The Church also strongly recommends that the faithful be enabled to receive communion at every Mass (assuming they are receiving reverently and without Mortal Sin, of course). She also calls for people to be able to receive communion "under both kinds" (host and chalice) on certain special occasions. A lot of places have decided to extend that to every Mass, but if you read this document (paragraph 55), you'll notice that is not what the document said we should do. It gives very specific occasions, which is one of the reasons our parish only offers the chalice a few times a year, as I've explained before in other bulletin articles.

Next we come to one of the other more visible changes from Vatican II: concelebration. Concelebration is the practice of two or more priests celebrating the *same Mass at the same time*. One priest (the Bishop if he is present) is the primary celebrant, but the other priests present vest, say certain parts of the prayer, and use certain gestures. Although it is one Mass, each priests is still offering the Mass for their own intention. You may not have realized it, but that isn't something priests typically did at Masses before 1963. There were rare and specific cases where something similar was done, but not like we have now. Nonetheless, the Council called for it to be done and so we now do it. It also lists out those times when a priest should concelebrate (Chrism Mass, Holy Thursday, Priest meetings, etc.) and notes that priests do have a right to celebrate individual Masses in most circumstances. Some people think this was a controversial decision, but most bishops and priests (and every pope since) have continued the practice without trouble.

Having laid out the principles for the Mass, the document takes up the topic of the other sacraments. It notes that, just as with Mass, things can creep into our practice over time that aren't necessarily central to the faith. Sometimes these things stop making sense as culture shifts. While the Sacraments are instituted by Christ, the sacramentals (blessings, other rituals outside of the 7 Sacraments) are instituted by the Church. As such, they are much more malleable. So, the Council decrees that these be adapted by appropriate authorities as soon as possible. This includes the use of the vernacular, again with the provision that some Latin remain in use. It also calls for new rituals to be created to fit newer aspects of culture. When we pick up next week, we'll start with the Catechumenate and Baptism and move through the other sacraments.
