Pastor's Column

Sacrosanctum Concilium VI

Thoughts and updates from Fr. Albert

Continuing our look at **Sacrosanctum Concilium** (1963 document on the Liturgy), we pick up with one of the other more significant changes called for by the council: **The Catechumenate**. Most people call it RCIA, but since ancient times, the process of becoming Catholic was called the Catechumenate. "Catechumen" comes from the Latin and Greek words for "being instructed," and refers to any adult preparing to be baptized. In the early Church, the process of preparing for Baptism was full of important rituals and steps in addition to the actual teaching. This document calls for that to be brough back into regular practice so that these sacramentals (rituals other than the sacraments) can sanctify the whole process. It also notes that, with careful discernment by the proper authority, some cultural adaptations can be made to the process.

Naturally, the next thing to consider is Baptism. This document asks for the ritual of Baptism to be revised. This is partly because many of the rituals for the Catechumenate were sort of folded into the Baptism itself. Since they were being restored to their proper place, the Baptism ritual needed to be adjusted accordingly. This process did not and could not change the essential part of Baptism (water and invoking the Trinity), but it called for some variations to fit into different circumstances. It also adjusted the Confirmation ritual a little to make its connection to Baptism clearer, asking that Confirmation candidates renew their Baptismal promises before being Confirmed.

Another of the more noticeable changes was to the sacrament previously called "Extreme Unction." The name was changed to "Anointing of the Sick" and the Church asked that people receive it sooner. The exact wording is "as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for him to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived" and is repeated both in the Catechism and in the book of Anointing. Some minor adjustments were made to the ritual itself, though again the essential part did not change (anointing with oil and saying the prescribed words).

The Sacrament of Holy Orders comes next in the document and the Bishops asked for revisions to the wording. The rituals were simplified, though many of the most significant parts were kept even if the wording and timing was changed. For Matrimony, the Council asked that the ritual "be revised and enriched in such a way that the grace of the sacrament is more clearly signified and the duties of the spouses are taught." They also called for some adaptations to cultural circumstances and for the Sacrament to be done within the context of Mass. Previously, it was done immediately prior to Mass.

Next are the blessings. The Council asked for blessings to be revised and for new ones to be created. It also pointed out that new blessings could be added by the proper authority when needed. One noteworthy shift was the call for some blessings to be made which could be given by qualified lay persons. As it turns out, the revision of the blessings was one of the less popular changes. Many of the newer blessings are fine and some are even beautiful, but many people find them a bit bland, vague, and generic. They are still effective because they are backed by the Church's authority, but many people still prefer to use the older forms for their more robust language and simpler format. Funnily enough, this is one place where the rituals after the council became *more* complicated because most of the blessings in the new book are connected to a whole set of readings, responses, and intercessions whereas most of the older ones were composed of one or two prayers. Either way, the blessings are backed up by the Church's intercession, so they are effective so long as they are done according to the Church's guidance.

The section on Sacramentals closes with a few short instructions on consecrations, vows, and funerals. It asks that the Consecration of Virgins and Profession of Vows be revised and done in the context of Mass. It calls for cultural adaptations to Funerals, including the color used. This is why many places stopped using black, although black is not forbidden and is still considered a cultural symbol of death in many places. The Council also asks for a special ritual Mass for the burial of infants to be drawn up and included in the revision. We'll pick up next time with the section on the Liturgy of the Hours.


